BOSTON BANKS WILL CANCEL  
POLICIES WITH LLOYDS UNDERWRITERS

... Banking Houses Carrying Lloyds Blanket Policies  
... Covering Fidelity of Their Employees and Offi-  
... cers Fear Effect of War.

New York, August 11.—The European war dis-  
... turbance has already had an important effect on the  
... attitude of some of the banking houses which have  
... been carrying Lloyds, London, blanket policies cov-  
... ering the fidelity of their employees and officers as  
... well as the bank's burglary and robbery hazard. It  
... was learned yesterday that the Shawmut Bank and  
... several other leading banks of Boston have decided  
... to cancel their Lloyds, London, contracts and seek  
... protection with the regularly admitted companies.  
... This change in the attitude of the banks is due to the  
... conditions now prevailing in Europe, President  
... William B. Joyce, of the National Surety Company  
... has issued the following letter to bankers, agents and  
... brokers:

The present European situation will, no doubt,  
... cause you to seriously consider whether or not your  
... Lloyds policy of insurance covering the employees  
... of your bank is adequate protection at this critical  
... time. In times like these Lloyds Underwriters may  
... be in a rather uncertain condition financially. At  
... least brokers would have reason to consider very  
... carefully the real value of any insurance executed  
... by the Lloyds Underwriters in war times. It is  
... stated that \$30,000,000 of money has been sent to  
... Europe and is yet unaccounted for. If this were in-  
... creased it might completely wipe out many, if not all,  
... of the Lloyds Underwriters. Then there is to be  
... considered the effect upon Lloyds' resources for mar-  
... ine losses, which might be enormous, especially if  
... the war hazard has not been excluded from these  
... policies. It has already been reported that there  
... have been 'captures' of several mercantile ships in-  
... sured by Lloyds, which in all probability will result  
... in the loss of the entire sum insured. The Lloyds,  
... besides assuming a great amount of 'war' risks by  
... including the 'war clause' in all marine policies, have  
... also issued a great number of speculative policies  
... covering the contingency of war between any of the  
... powers of Europe. Any such policies, so issued,  
... means a total loss of the face amount, which  
... undoubtedly will result in a very heavy loss to the  
... underwriters, in addition to the legitimate marine  
... losses.

Assuming Lloyds will not become financially crippled  
... by reason of heavy losses, to make no reference to  
... the other serious situations in which Lloyds finds  
... itself, it would be rather difficult at least to get your  
... money for losses, and, after all, that is what you pay  
... for, but will you get it while the 'moratorium' is in  
... effect in England? Other serious delays may rea-  
... sonably be expected. It is in times like these that  
... you want your money if a loss occur. An impres-  
... sive looking contract is valueless unless there are  
... real assets to support it.

We shall be pleased to issue our direct policy to  
... bridge over this uncertain situation, or issue our  
... 'standby' policy to be collectible only if Lloyds fail to  
... pay.

SHOULD LIFE COMPANIES INVEST  
IN RAILWAY SECURITIES

Law Prohibits This Class of Investments in New York  
State, But Many Believe Them to be  
Advantageous.

As the investment of funds plays so important a  
... role in the scheme of insurance, especially is this true  
... of life insurance, anything that treats on this subject  
... is of vital interest.

Of life insurance it may be said that the investing of  
... its funds is the most important part of the business, as  
... upon this rests at least one element, the most signifi-  
... cant, of a company's success or failure.

F. X. Quinn, vice-president and treasurer of the  
... Fidelity Mutual Life, recently added an interesting  
... contribution to the subject of investment of insurance  
... funds. This occurred in an address which he deliv-  
... ered last month before the Fidelity Leader's Club  
... on the occasion of its annual meeting held in Phila-  
... delphia.

Though he may not have enunciated any new theo-  
... ries, he doubtless confirmed some which others have  
... advanced and on which there has existed a certain  
... amount of diversity of opinion. For instance, he con-  
... demns collateral loans and stocks as not being suit-  
... able investments for life insurance funds, saying: "The  
... former properly fall within the functions of a bank-  
... ing institution and the latter render the company a  
... partner in the particular enterprise instead of a  
... creditor, which it properly should be."

Certain officials of New York companies, in spite of  
... the law prohibiting the investment of life insurance  
... funds in railroad stocks, and obliging them to dispose  
... of those now held, maintain that this class of securi-  
... ties is an advantageous one for the companies.—Money  
... and Risk.

QUICK WORK WITH COVERS  
SAVES THOUSANDS OF DOLLARS

Fire at 23 Bleury Street Damages the Premises of  
Nine Different Firms—Firemen Did Good  
Work.

Through a blaze that broke out late last night on  
... the top floor of the three-story building at 23 Bleury  
... street, in the workshop of N. Stoves & Co., jewelry  
... manufacturers and diamond setters, eight other  
... firms who occupied premises in the same building  
... suffered damage from smoke or water.

The quick response of the central division of the  
... fire brigade, under District Chief Briere, to an alarm  
... turned in by Constable Dow, of the Cheminoye street  
... station, from the box at the corner of Bleury and  
... Jarry streets, was responsible for the fire being  
... confined to the floor on which it originated. It was  
... necessary for the fire-fighters to use three streams,  
... and the water found its way down to the second and  
... first floors. Captain Taylor and the men of the Sal-  
... vage Corps did good work with their covers, and  
... saved thousands of dollars' worth of goods from  
... damage by water.

The occupants of the building who suffered from  
... smoke and water were the Jaffay Brothers Co.;  
... Griffiths, Griffiths & Varley; Auld Muclaige Co.;  
... William V. Benedict Co.; Bush & Nunns; George  
... Witowski; Montreal Plating Co.; W. A. Wood and the  
... Central Cafe.

FIGHT TO LOWER INFANT  
DEATH RATE IS SUCCESSFUL

Milk Stations in City Have Done Great Work During  
Sultry Weather and Many Lives  
Have Been Saved.

The fight to lower the infant death rate still goes  
... on in the city and volunteers who are ready to give  
... both their services and their money are plentiful.  
... This battle to save life has met with remarkable  
... success. Great work has been done by the four milk  
... stations in the city. Over two hundred and fifty  
... babies were treated at the Local Council and Univer-  
... sity Settlement stations. At the baby hospital, nearly  
... fifty more were cared for, most of them inmates of  
... the hospital, as the officials are too busy with pre-  
... parations for occupying their new building to be able  
... to do much outside work at present. At the Ivelry  
... Settlement, treatment and pure or modified milk  
... have been supplied to another large contingent of  
... little folks of the neighborhood.

One hundred and thirty-seven babies were supplied  
... with milk at the Local Council Milk stations during  
... the month of July, of whom thirty-eight were new  
... patients, and in spite of the numerous stifling days,  
... and the condition many of the babies were in when  
... first brought for treatment, there were only three  
... deaths. The three doctors, who each hold clinics on  
... two days in the week, held one hundred and fifty-  
... five clinics in all, to examine the babies and pre-  
... scribe treatment. Sixty-five of the babies are given  
... modified milk, according to formulae prescribed by  
... the doctors, the others receiving ordinary pure milk.  
... There are nine of the cases receiving ferri milk, the  
... others paying such sums as they can afford. That  
... many of these are much below the cost of the milk  
... is shown by the fact that although 597 gallons of milk  
... were used during the month, the receipts from the pa-  
... tients amounted to only about \$166. The nurse in  
... charge of the station paid one hundred and forty-  
... one visits during the month, giving treatment to the  
... babies and instruction to the mothers on the care  
... of the children and of the milk and receptacles in  
... which it is contained. This year, as in previous years,  
... the station has been supplied with tickets admitting  
... mothers with their sick babies to the summer crechs  
... conducted on the mountain by the King's Daughters'  
... Society, and a number have received these tickets.

No Deaths Recorded.  
There were no deaths amongst the little patients  
... of the University Settlement milk station. Three ba-  
... bies were so ill when first brought to the station that  
... no treatment was attempted there. They were sent  
... immediately to the hospital, but unfortunately each of  
... the three cases was hopeless and all died. The one  
... hundred and twenty-eight babies on the books, of  
... whom nineteen were new cases during the month,  
... consumed 1,533 quarts of milk, about half of which  
... was paid for, the balance being supplied free of  
... charge to many, who owing to lack of work for the  
... bread-winners of the family, were finding times  
... hard. The cost of the milk was \$305.83, and the re-  
... ceipts for the month amounted to \$68.25.

MARINE UNDERWRITERS LACK  
UNIFORM WAR RISK CLAUSE

Insuring Public World Over Would Welcome Uni-  
form War Risk Clause.

At the Congress of the International Association  
... of Marine Underwriters, which was to be held on  
... Sept. 15 and 17 in Scheveningen, but is probably off  
... indefinitely now, one of the most important reports  
... to be submitted is that on the "Liability of the Un-  
... derwriters for War Risks," a subject of exceptional  
... interest at the moment. Herr A. Duncker, of Ham-  
... burg, is the author.

In his report Herr Duncker deals with the legal  
... provisions in regard to the inclusion of the war risk.  
... It is established that the laws of a large number of  
... European countries hold the underwriters liable for  
... all dangers, that is to say, including the war risk  
... and the consequences arising out of it. Since, how-  
... ever, it has proved impossible for the underwriters to  
... determine a suitable premium for the war risk that is  
... in time of peace, altogether uncertain in degree,  
... the underwriters have excluded this risk by special  
... clauses in almost all their policies as, for instance,  
... by the clause "only for sea risk" in the Hamburg  
... policies.

This does, indeed, protect the insurer from the  
... damages that might directly accrue to him through  
... war and warlike events, but it makes him liable for  
... all indirect losses, caused by the existence of a state  
... of war. The clause "free from molestation of war"  
... contained in many of the inland policies relieves the un-  
... derwriter of every obligation as soon as the war be-  
... gins to exercise an influence on the insured venture.  
... In applying this clause the war risk insurer runs  
... the risk of having under certain conditions to hold him-  
... self liable also for sea risks which were not re-  
... ceeded upon in the assumption of the war risk.

In view of the difficulties that have in practice  
... arisen on account of the diversity of the war clauses,  
... it is recommended that a uniform and like-worded  
... clause be agreed upon by which the conception and  
... the extent of the eventualities that are to be re-  
... garded as included in war risk are laid down. A  
... measure of this kind, it has been held, would also  
... be certain of a welcome from the insuring public.
