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GOOD DAIRYING IN HASTINGS CO.

Mr. W. E. Tammam of our county is a farmer of whom we are all proud. He has dairying down to a fine science.

There are two thicknesses of steel with an air space between bottom-sides, lid and all being tight, the lid is fitted so that when shut no air can get in.

Mr. Tammam believes the silo to be almost indispensable for milking cows, and although he has a large run of rough, natural pasture, yet never misses more than two months of the year that the milking cows are not fed on silage twice a day.
