TRAGIC STORY IS TOLD BY MR. PHILIP LAWLOR TODAY

How Brantford Man and His Son Battled in Angry Waters For an Hour and a Half Before Getting to Safety.

Philip Lawlor and his son Herbert returned to the city last night from the scene of the terrible disaster of the Empress of Ireland.

To-day Mr. Lawlor is in bed at the Salvation Army Citadel, threatened with an attack of inflammation of the lungs, and is indeed in a very serious condition. When seen by the Courier this morning, Mr. Lawlor was in a very weak condition, and his story was a most distressing one.

The police ambulance was given an emergency call and responded quickly. Mr. Foster was not dazed when it arrived, but he expired ten minutes after his arrival at the General Hospital.
