KING AND QUEEN OBEY FOOD LAWS

The British Royal Family Among First to Conform to Restrictions

London, Feb. 15.—(Correspondence of The Associated Press)—King George and Queen Mary were among the first in England, as was Mrs. Woodrow Wilson in the United States, to make their household conform to the rigorous rationing system of a food minister or administrator. Like the White House at Washington, the royal family and staff at Buckingham Palace have been placed on the diet suggested by the man chosen to conserve the nation's food supply in England, Lord Rhonda.

From the early days of the Ministry of Food the King has insisted that every suggestion for self-denial which has been put before the people of the country must be loyally observed throughout the royal household.

The royal household is a large and varying one. Its changing character makes some difficulty in the rationing, but if any error is made in the calculation it is in the direction of "less" rather than "more." We keep in constant touch with the Ministry of Food, learning each day whatever new regulations may be impending. Quite often recently the royal larder has been empty of such commodities as butter, marmalade, and tea, and we have gone without from King down. The King and Queen have repeatedly spoken to me to impress me with the duty of self-denial in food and drink. The King in the first days of the war pledged himself to total abstinence from alcoholic beverages, and that pledge holds good to-day over the whole household. The King actually tries always to anticipate restrictions. A long while ago he insisted on coal economy in the palace. Waste of fuel or coal constitutes a grave offence among the servants of the King.

It is an amazing deliverance from trial and sorrow, and a glorious promotion to the immediate presence and fellowship of God himself, and his redeemed who have gone before. This is what has happened to our beloved sister who has left us. Sorrow therefore cannot be the dominant note. There are tears, perhaps some tears of regret as there always are—regrets are something done in the past or for something left undone, but in this case there can be little occasion for that. Faithful, wise, and tender wife and mother during a strenuous life has been all along trusted and honored and loved by a husband and children of like spirit. And now that she has been taken from them for a little while it is the tenderest feelings that stir their hearts and ours. It would be futile for me to attempt to picture her first days of bereavement in this manner, but in her coming this occasion, and most intimate friends who are present; and each one has in his heart a picture he does not wish disturbed. Perhaps it may be allowable, however, to quote the estimate given in the Town Council's address of two months ago. Her kind and gentle bearing coupled with firmness, her watchful care over her family in her model home, and her interest in what was best for the social and religious welfare of the town have made her presence among us of high and permanent value. It was my privilege to see her once and again during her last illness; and her meek and quiet spirit only became more evident. Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his Saints, and so the Tender Shepherd guided her down to the brink, and carried her over to be with Himself. He will guard till He Himself shall awake her at His coming and restore to her her redeemed body in eternal vigor and beauty. Now the laborer's task is o'er; Now the battle-day is past; Now upon the further shore we lands the voyager at last. Father, in Thy gracious keeping Leave we now Thy servant sleeping. "We remember that her beloved husband lies apparently unconscious of his bereavement; and perhaps his first intimation of it will be when he finds her ahead of him on the other shore, where he will share in her glorious liberty and service. "He that guided and blessed them will in like manner honor their children and their children's children while they look to the Saviour for grace to keep His covenant and to remember his commandments to do them. May the Lord grant them joy for mourning, and make them worthy successors of worthy sires."

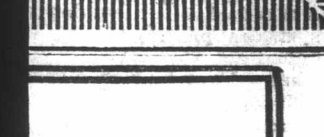
