This new department is an outcome of the desire on the part of Canada to maintain as complete control as possible of her own forces. Sir Edward Kemp has, for some time past, been negotiating with the Imperial authorities, and has been successful in establishing the principle that the Canadian authorities should have complete control of all matters relating to organization and administration of the Canadian overseas forces, with the exception of those which directly affect military operations.

This section at General Head-quarters will be a direct and convenient channel whereby the Cauadian viewpoint may be presented in those matters which require reference to General Headquarters, and through it documents and communications relating to such matters will be forwarded direct to the Canadian Overseas Ministry in London, and vice versa, for consideration, instead of going through channels which in the past have caused more or less delay.
