The American Grocer presents the public with some interesting statistics as to the growth of the drink habit in the United States. It does not confine itself to the merely intoxicating methods of moistening the mucous membrane of man, but deals with all beverages other than aereated waters and common water itself. According to the authority named, the people of the United States spent no less than \$1,-228,674,925, in flavoring their breaths in the year 1900. The sum was divided as follows: \$1,059,563,787

Alcoholic drinks Coffee Tea Cocoa

\$1,228,674,925

The great preponderance of alcoholic drinks in the table does not mean that the people consumed more of such, but that the "nip with a sting to it" costs a great deal more. It is calculated that the price paid for coffee would furnish 1,257,985,296 gallons, and as 50 r cent of the intoxicating expenditure was for beer the figures would represent 1,221,500,160 gallons of that

The Grocer has been investigating and shows that by the per capita figures for the past ten years the consumption of intoxicanting liquors is not on the increase. Indeed, the consumption fell from 1.43 in 1891 to 1.27 in 1900; wine went from .45 down .40. There was a slight increase in beer, which went from 15.31 to 16.01.

The conclusion is that, nothwithing the immense total expenditure for intoxicating liquors in the North American republic, the people only spend 4 1-2 cents a day per capita in drink, and the tendency is to adopt the European-German-custom of using beer instead of strong drink. It is but one of several instances tend-ing to show that the European element in the United States was changing the American character instead of being changed by it.

Poison Proof People. There are entire communities of polson proof people who partake of doses of white arsenic with as much zest as the average person partakes of a meal. Chief among these singularly gifted people are the Styrian and Corinthian shepherds who inhabit the districts of Lamprecht, Salzburg, Hartberg, Leoben, Oberzeirung and the Erzgebirge mountains. The sturdy mountaineers consider that arsenic improves their wind for chamois climbing.

Some years ago Dr. Knapp put two of these men through their paces before the German Society of Physicians assembled at Gratz. The one ate six grains of white arsenic, or enough to kill three men, without experiencing the slightest inconvenience. The other partook of four grains of yellow arsenic, or orpiment, with equal impunity. It was explained that, seeing the good effect of the drug upon the coats and condition of their flocks, many of these shepherds start the practice under the impression that taken in moderation it is good for human beings also.

Usually started with a small weekly dose spread upon bread and butter, the embryo arsenic eater has to undergo a very severe test of his devotion to the drug. Violent sickness and burning drug speedily asserts its fatal power

over its devotee. Any attempt to leave off the drug is generally fatal. The women of these arsenic eating districts are famous for their beautiful complexions and luxuri-
