Washington, Jan. 7.—The Austro-Hun- garian Embassy in Washington has re- ceived an official communication with re- gard to the amnesty decreed by Francis Joseph, Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary, in commemoration of the be- ginning of the sixtieth year of his reign.

This amnesty is extended to all citi- zens of Austria-Hungary and Bosnia Herzegovina, who, being under military obligations, have been declared deserters on account of non-observance of enrol- ment call.
