

For more. Between 20 and 30 hours lighted. The Methodist Chapel will be lighted by the same. (Sunday.) We have seen the lamps that have been used in the Vestry and Class Rooms, and estimated, not without a high degree of pleasure, the trial lighting of a circular chandelier—if we may so call it—carrying 31 lamps, which produced a splendid effect. The quality of the Gas is superior, and the tightness of the main pipes and interior fittings, are far more complete than the Engineer himself expected, or than they usually are in a first attempt. In fact, the undertaking has been so far, eminently successful, and independently of the satisfaction the public and well-wishers to the property of the Town and Island in general, must experience; for its success, it affords a convincing proof that when public undertakings of this nature are not about in the proper manner, and proceeded with order and determination, they will be productive of the same results, that they are in other countries. But this is only the beginning of improvements, and will lead the way, we trust to the incorporation of the Town, the introduction of a copious supply of good, and wholesome water; clean, well made, Gas lighted, streets and side walks, an extended and judicious system of sewerage, inclosure and planting of public squares, and all those other amenities and decorations of life, that constitute the march of improvement. The rate of burning, is by experiment, as follows:

Mr. J. W. Morrison has favored us with a calculation from a trial of his burners.

From six number 3, Union jet burners, he consumed in one hour, 18 cubic feet of Gas, which at 2s. per Hundred cubic feet, will make the cost 4s. 6d. per six burners equal the light of 18 best London mould Tallow Candles, 1-4th of which is 3 mould Candles, the cost of which is 7s. making Gas, all things considered—as we shall hereafter show—fully 60 per cent cheaper than Candles.

We shall notice this important subject again, and give more copious details as respects the comparative expense of using Gas and Oil, Tallow and Fuel.
