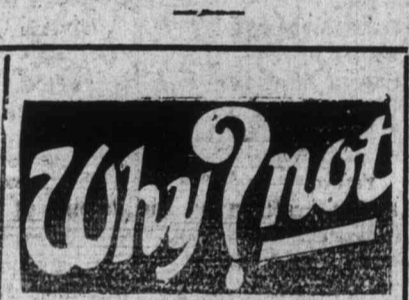
It is said that Canadian soldiers in England have been carrying at the rate of 100 per week.
