**MONTEAL Live Stock.**  
MONTEAL, July 9.—About 650 head of butchers' cattle at east end abattoir. Trade dull, and prices, except for very heavy, lower. Best animals sold at from 4 to 50, but few brought over 45c. Large number held over, unsold. About 700 sheep offered, demand brisk. Shipments buying largest at from \$5 to \$6; other sheep at from \$3.50 to \$4.50. Lambs from \$2.25 to \$3.75, most sales at about \$3. Fat hogs not so plentiful as last week, prices advancing at from 10c per lb. Horse trade fairly active during past week. Shipped from here during past week, 106, costing \$10,350.50, or an average of \$97.76. Highest priced lot, 16 horses, which cost \$1,752.50, lowest priced, six horses, cost \$390. Business in cattle unusually dull during past week. General impression is that although plenty of cattle in country, good grass shippers not so plentiful owing to dry weather. Receipts of horses at Montreal exchange, Point St. Charles, for week ending July 7, 1888, 140; shipped during week, 132; sales for week, 2 averages, \$150.
