LOADS FISH FOR EUROPE.—The S. S. Hesse, which brought a cargo of coal here from Cardiff, has finished unloading. She sails this afternoon for Indian Harbour, Labrador, where she will load fish for European markets.

On Tuesday evening last a cab and a motor car owned by Mr. Collishaw, were in collision on Water Street. No injury was sustained by the occupants of either vehicle but damage was done to the amount of \$60; the lamp of the car being broken with other damages.

The banking schooner Marconi owned by Mr. Pike, of Belloram, was sold yesterday to Mr. Robert Churchill; the price paid being \$2,300. Mr. Churchill will use his new purchase for trading in Conception Bay. The Marconi is a fine staunch little vessel of 55 tons and is ten years old.

FUNERAL LARGELY ATTENDED.—All that was mortal of the late Jacob Breen was laid to rest yesterday afternoon in Mount Carmel Cemetery. The funeral was largely attended and prominent amongst the mourners were the officers and members of the T. A. & B. Society of which deceased was a member. At the Cathedral Rev. Fr. The R. M. S. Mongolian reached port at nine o'clock this morning after a passage of nine days and two days' delay was occasioned. No damage was sustained and she sailed the following Monday. Concealment of Birth.

Charge Dismissed.
The hearing of the case in which a young woman of Georgetown was charged with concealment of birth, was continued on Tuesday afternoon before Judge Conroy and resulted in the accused being dismissed. After Mr. Hutchings, K. C., had put the case for the prosecution, His Honour in summing up intimated that in view of the evidence disclosed and by reason of the testimony of the two medical practitioners, whose evidence had been taken some time ago, a sufficient case had not been made out to warrant a conviction against the accused, and the complaint was dismissed. Mr. Higgins appeared for the accused.

Obituary.

We note with regret to-day the passing of Mrs. James Funchion, which sad event occurred last evening after a prolonged illness. Deceased was 27 years old, and a daughter of the late John and Margaret Summers. Mr. Funchion, husband of the deceased, is at present en route to St. John's from the Canadian Northwest, and had hoped to see his wife but death came all too soon. Besides a husband, two children and a sister are left to mourn to all of whom sincere sympathy is expressed.

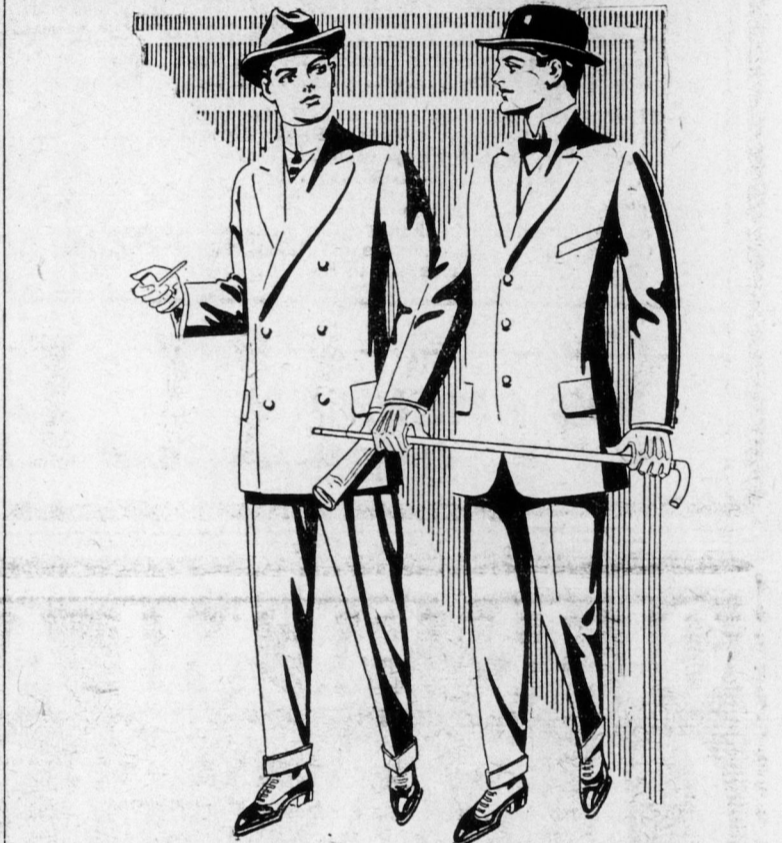




