In a word, it is the promise of the Government of Newfoundland to the holder of a Bond that the Government will pay an amount to the holder, together with half-yearly interest at a rate over twice that paid by the banks on savings deposits, and nearly seven times the value of money retained in one's pocket, and therefore not bringing any income. It is true our sons have gone in numbers to fight for Liberty, but how can they be equipped and maintained in food, clothing and arms if those at home do not lend their money for the purpose?
