TO FLY TO NORTH POLE.
NOME, July 31.

Omdal, aviator, and one other. It is understood his plan to fly across the North Pole is postponed until next year.

LONDON, July 31.
The speaker of the House of Commons, in replying to a request of Horatio Bottomley's solicitors for a postponement of the motion for his expulsion from the House, pending the hearing of a new appeal to the House of Lords, said he was unable to interfere.

AMBUSHED AND KILLED.
DUBLIN, July 31.
Two Colonels and five soldiers of the Government forces were killed and many wounded near Maryboro, Friday, by irregulars, who ambushed and blew up an armored car in which they were riding.
