THE THEORY OF PLAYING SECOND BASE.

(Respectfully dedicated to Billy Callahan, Billy McRindle, Gus Delaney and Rocky Gessa.)

Miller Huggins, manager of the New York Yankees, had poor hands, could not throw, was weak on touching runners, but was a great second baseman because he, more thoroughly than any other man who has played second base, appreciated the importance of taking up a standing position as far back of the base and towards centre field as possible.

The particular advantages he secured were these:—

(1) He always had the base in front of him when he had to make a play there.

(2) He kept most of his plays on his left side, on the gloved hand, and between him and the first baseman.

(3) He got many balls driven hard over second base which a baseman playing in the usual position towards first base could not get.

Huggins was always going towards his play—always had the play in front of him where he could see it every time. If the ball was hit over second base Huggins did not have to rush over there, make a frenzied effort to pick it up, recover, readjust his position, turn and throw from a bad position to the first baseman. If the ball was hit over second Huggins got it with less effort than any other man that ever played second base, was in a favourable position to throw, and always had the play in front of him.

If the ball was hit between him and first base and he was always going towards his play and had the ball on his glove hand side. Rare indeed was Huggins obliged to run away from his play, dive for the ball, turn and throw back to first base. Of course there were confirmed right field hitters who made Huggins move over towards first base.
