The attention of the Public is called to the following Section of St. John's Municipal Act: Section 253: Every person who shall without just cause or excuse refuse to permit the appraisers to enter and inspect the premises occupied by him for the purpose of assessing the value thereof, or who shall refuse to give them correct information, or shall knowingly give them false information with regard to his ownership of any property, or to the rent which he derives therefrom or pays therefor, or to the cost of such property, or to his liability to the Poll Tax, whether as to his age, length of residence in the City, non-liability to the City Tax, or otherwise, or who shall in any way impede or attempt to impede the said appraisers in the discharge of their duties under this Act shall upon conviction forfeit and pay to the City a sum of not more than twenty dollars, and shall, in default of payment, be subject to imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty days.
