The assessment of the city of Medicine Hat for 1910 is \$4,838,280, an increase of nearly 500,000 over that of 1909. The rate of taxation is 10 mills in the dollar.

An application has been made to the provincial legislature for amendments to the city charter giving it power to assess land at its full value and exempt improvements to the extent of 50 per cent of their value.

The debenture indebtedness of the city is \$506.673.12 or about 10 1-2 per cent. of the assessment. Of this amount \$198.665.68 was expended in waterworks; \$118,405.26 in gas plant and \$190,602.18 in general improve-
