necessity of going before the county judge.

Is your name on or off the list?

No one can be certain unless he person-

ally inspects it.

The only necessary qualifications are:

1. You are a British subject.

2. You are 21 years of age or upwards.

3. You reside in the city.

This afternoon and evening will

be a most suitable time to examine the

lists and make the necessary affidavit,

which cost the voter nothing. Be sure

now, and avoid disappointment on election

day.
