Owes none of its vitality to the public vote, no matter how careless they may have been in their public duties, they have only one to conciliate; they have no constituents to meet, and they are perfectly well aware that their only chance of any lengthened continuance of such an unsound system as the present, is to stifle all efforts at reform before they come up for discussion; the first step is the most difficult, and the official members of the Legislative Council are well aware that when the people are properly represented in the Colony, the first step is to be taken.

Representative Institutions.

Few Colonial Governors have had so many opportunities of showing good statesmanship as the present Governor of this Colony, and few men holding the position of constitutional advisers of the Governor, by virtue of their offices as members of the Executive and Legislative Councils, have had more scope for such a display of administrative talent as can be made in a small Colony, as those gentlemen who have belonged to the Executive Council of British Columbia since the Union. The Colony has passed through a season of great depression, and has felt the want of that fostering care which an able and energetic Governor, backed by an active and judicious Executive Council, might have extended to her. The remodelling of the Government after the two colonies were united, afforded some room for the exercise of diplomatic talents in the Governor, and of administrative energy amongst his advisers. Fortunately the Colony has not suffered materially in her prospects in spite of the complete failure of the Government to do anything to help it in its time of trial. She has been kept back by lack of energy, but the great resources of the Colony still exist, and the perseverance of the colonists is gradually restoring confidence, and is slowly but surely establishing the fame of British Columbia as a place, which, though last, is not destined to be the least of the settlements of the world, in point of wealth and importance. But although opportunities have been thrown away and neglected, other chances may yet occur, and few men who have either achieved, or been placed in positions of any importance will allow every opportunity of distinguishing themselves to pass away; it is within the bounds of possibility that the Governor of this Colony may yet show himself inclined to listen at the last moment to the voice of the people, and he may testify his inclination by inviting the Council to consider the propriety of a change in the Constitution, with a view to obtaining both a preponderance of popular members and a liberal franchise under which members can be elected. It is impossible that Mr. Seymour can have any dread of representative institutions; it is true that under such a form of Government there might be more actual routine work for the Chief Executive to perform than he thinks proper to get through under the existing system; but the responsibility of the Governor is unquestionably much less in a Colony where there are representative institutions, than in a Crown Colony. It is more easy to understand the sort of natural antipathy, that members of the Legislative Council have to the inauguration of any change at all in the Constitution. They have not, as advisers of the Governor shown any administrative talent, nor have they evinced any of that aptitude for public business which is so necessary for the success of those who seek to take any prominent place as members of a House of Representatives; their duties as members of the Council are much more easily discharged, so long as they belong to a "select" assembly, which

The Agricultural and Horticultural Exhibition.

Friday, Oct 9

After a lapse of three years and since the last show of the character above mentioned was held, the citizens and public in general have resolved to revive the once annual exhibitions, and yesterday in the display shown demonstrated, that in most departments we are again on the road to agricultural and stock breeding eminence. The amount subscribed for prizes, as well as the number of articles exhibited, by we understand, 130 entries, must be gratifying to all of us, and particularly to those who more immediately interested themselves in securing so successful a result; this too considering the limited time left to make arrangements with outside districts. The exhibition was held in the cattle yard of J. P. Davies & Co. Port street, with the adjacent vacant lots fenced in and covered over with canvas for all articles except the live stock. Early in the morning the premises and street in the vicinity were decorated with a variety of flags, festoons and hung across the street, with the crowd of people and vehicles passing to and fro, gave the scene an animated appearance. By 11 o'clock the arrangements which reflected much credit on the managers, were completed, and the judges commenced awarding the prizes. J. P. Pemberton, Thomas Harris, and Mr. C. F. Pennington, as Judges of the Live Stock, Messrs. Lawson, B. Wallace, J. Lowe & J. L. Jones, Capt. Good, E. H. Jackson and A. Hunter acting as Judges of the produce, fruits, flowers, &c. It was universally admitted that such articles as were exhibited, particularly in the latter classes, were excellent in character. Amongst such an assemblage of articles, in live stock, which was perhaps somewhat limited in numbers, we may mention the sheep (Southdowns) and hogs of Mr. McKenzie, cow and calf and yearling heifer shown by Mr. Sars, of the "Richmond"; two three-year old heifers owned by Mr. J. D. Pemberton; brood sow, Mr. N. C. Bailey, which took two prizes; the sheep exhibited by Mr. Holden, Spring Ridge; five fat sheep belonging to Mr. Harvey, Upland farm; and the cattle from Dr. Tolmie's farm. Eight saddle horses were entered; the first prize was awarded to Mr. Targoes and a special commendation given to Mr. Riether's horse. Taken upon the whole, the show of stock was scarcely what might have been expected although it must be recollected that fine animals of any kind are not the first products of a young country, though, of course, such results are only the consequence of long competition and increasing wealth. The produce, fruits, vegetables, cereals and hogs, however, were excellent in every branch, and excited much admiration. It is impossible to particularize in this department all the articles which deserve honorable mention, but we cannot omit the magnificent hogs grown at Saanich; the peas, apples, plums, grapes; the carrots, potatoes, onions, beans, peas and bouquets of flowers, that graced the tables. Messrs. Clarkson & Herring of New Westminster, brought down some fine samples of fruit and vegetables from the mainland; some peaches and quinces exhibited deserve a leading notice. The exhibition of poultry contained some fine specimens of geese, Spanish fowls, ducks, pigeons and bantams. There were also straws, home made wicks, trunks, smoked salmon, together with such like articles of home manufacture, which were proven not to be neglected, and the samples exhibited, gave strong evidence of the progress of the Colony in this particular, which will hereafter enrich her. In the dairy produce, the Cowichea butter, took the lead, and a large jar of cream prepared by the Messrs. Davis, was highly commended. Amongst the cereals, a sample of Canada

Wheat, grown by Messrs. Galbraith and Hawks of Soda Creek, which attracted much attention, but there was not sufficient of it shown, to obtain a prize. Amongst the fruits, the contribution of plums from Capt. Good's garden, for variety, size, richness of color and wihal neat arrangement, caused much comment. There were many other articles exhibited which earned special commendation, but our space will only allow us to select the most prominent. In the afternoon, as the day was unusually fine, a large number of people of all classes, visited the exhibition, and the universal verdict was that although the number of articles exhibited was not so large as could have been desired, owing to a little indifference, and supineness on the part of some of our farmers, there was abundance to show what great things the Colony is capable of, and how largely her material interests may be advanced by these exhibitions. It is to be hoped, therefore the idea of having an annual exhibition for the whole Colony at different towns, in rotation, will be earnestly carried out by those who have the power to make each year's exhibition an acquisition success. The volunteer band was in attendance, and added much to the pleasure of the day by their excellent performances.
