being unusually productive. I have sown it alongside of other kinds of wheat grown in this province, and while they were distroyed in part by the weevil, and the straw rusted, beside a great many black heads, this was proof against them all. I sowed it in what we farmers call weevil time, on the 20th of Muy, 1869, and on the 22nd May, 1870, and had a yield of 12 and 14 bushels each year respectively, and this year I sowed one bushel, giving all the chance I could for the weevil, and just threshed 12 bushels off of the one sown. I am convinced by the trials I have given it that it will resist the attacks of the weevil better than any other variety of wheat, and also that it can be grown in any situation, such as intervale farms or low places. It resists the weevil or rust on account of its coseness of chaff, and a very heavy beard. Some of the crop of 1869 and 1861, far exceeded anything of the kind I have ever seen grown, many of the straws I measured were six feet long, clear and bright, and I had one and a half bushels to the stook. It weighed 65 pounds to the bushel, and makes, without exception, as good flour as any wheat.

"If the farmers of Nova Scotia wish to grow their own wheat, and save the constant drain of money from the Province for imported flour, they would do well to give this wheat a trial. I have been very particular in keeping the seed pure, and I think, for the present, it would be very wrong to grind it into flour. Call and see a sample of the wheat at Messrs. J. Northup & Sons, and examine for yourselves. Also, at Simon Fraser's Intercolonial Hotel, Truro."
