

Pierre Bosset

Pierre Bosset is Director of Research and Planning at the Commission des droits de la personne et des droits de la jeunesse (Québec). He received his law degree at the Université de Montréal in 1980, his masters in international human rights law at the University of Essex (U.K) in 1984, and a masters in international relations from Cambridge University in 1989. Admitted to the Montréal Bar in 1981, Me Bosset had been active in several community associations. At the Commission since 1985, first as a Legal Adviser, his areas of interest include the concepts of equality and discrimination, the implications of religious diversity in the legal and institutional contexts, the recognition of economic and social rights, and the international protection of human rights. Part of his work consists in contributing to Québec's reports to the United Nations on the domestic implementation of human rights treaties.

Me Bosset has taught in the Law Department at the Université du Québec à Montréal, in the Faculty of Law at the Université de Montréal and at the École de formation professionnelle of the Québec Bar. In 1994, he was visiting scholar in the Faculty of Law at the University of Kyoto (Japan). He is author of *La discrimination indirecte dans le domaine de l'emploi* (Éditions Yvon Blais, 1989) and co-editor of *Les droits de la personne et les enjeux de la médecine moderne* as well as *Des enfants et des droits*, published by the Presses de l'Université Laval in 1996 and 1997 respectively.
