Interpretation of Part

29. La présente Partie s'applique au pétrole qui est mis sur le marché intérieur ou international ou qui est mis sur le marché international de pétrole brut, sans compter les quantités réservées à l'exportation de la province d'origine.

Object

30. La présente Partie a pour objet de :

1. donner l'assurance législative de principe des mesures qui, dans la mesure du possible, permettent au gouvernement du Canada :
2. d'assurer l'efficacité des prix sans compter les frais de transport du pétrole brut utilisés au Canada pour la production d'énergie;
3. de régler, au Canada, les différends entre les producteurs de pétrole et les consommateurs au Canada contre l'instabilité des prix payés pour le pétrole international;
4. donner aux producteurs internationaux

"government price" means, in relation to any quantity or kind of crude oil, the maximum price established by the regulations for the purpose of international trade;

"price" means the value in money of the consideration given for a quantity of crude oil or the value of that quantity of oil, as may be determined by regulation in a case where no consideration is given therefor, exclusive of the amount of any charge imposed under Part 1;

"producer-province" means a province in which the production of crude oil is normally produced, extracted or reserved in that province in a month or each month a significant quantity of that crude oil is normally available for use outside that province in each month;

"province of production" means, in relation to any quantity of crude oil, the producer-province in which it was produced, extracted or reserved;

Definition of Part

30. This Part applies to crude oil that enters into international or interprovincial trade or that is mined or blended with crude oil that has been produced for export out of the province of production.

Purpose of Part

31. The purpose of this Part is to provide legislative authority for measures that will, so far as may be practicable, enable the Government of Canada :

- (a) to achieve a uniform price structure of transportation costs for crude oil used in Canada outside the province of production;
- (b) to achieve a balance of Canada between the interests of consumers and producers in Canada; and
- (c) to protect consumers in Canada from instability of prices for petroleum in the international market;

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
