Members would have us believe that we deliberately deceived the Canadian people because we have tried to alleviate the plight of people and to create jobs for the unemployed! Canadians will have to pass judgment during this coming year on the behaviour of these Hon. Members. They will be asked to decide who is right in this debate, this government who tries to alleviate the sufferings of some Canadians or Opposition Members who merely try to make political gains by making unfounded accusations.

In conclusion, I believe it is most important for us to realize that this government stands for the interests of the poor in this country. That has always made and will always make the reputation of the Liberal Party, Mr. Speaker. That is why we are the government and that is why we will stay in power in the future.
