"a certificate (or certificates) from the Clerk
"of the Crown in Chancery, showing that the
"Honourable.....has, (or have) been
"summoned to the Senate." B. 111-112.

5. If newly appointed Senators are below Attendance of the Bar, waiting to be introduced, the Speaker announced. says: "Honourable Senators,—I have the "honour to inform you that there is a Senator "(or are Senators) without, waiting to be in-"troduced,"—and then sits down. B. 112.

6. The new Senator comes up to the Clerk's Introduction Table, escorted by two Senators, and his of Senators. Letters Patent being read, he takes the Oath of Allegiance, which is administered by the Clerk as a Commissioner under Section 128 British N. A. Act, 1867, signs the roll, and then goes to the Speaker, who rises to shake hands, and congratulating him, requests him to take his seat.

After which The Honourable the Speaker says: "Honourable Senators,—I have the "honour to inform the Senate that the Clerk "has laid upon the Table the certificate of one "of the Commissioners setting forth that the "Honourable.....has made and subscribed
