iety of opinions were given as to the mode of heir future proceedings, and many reflections ad paffed on their prefent mifery, the captain efolved, that it would be most advisable to atempt to clear the ship as soon as the weather yould permit. Accordingly, the men who were ble, began with bars and shovels to dig the ice, nd to lay it in such a manner as to form a baricado round her, to prevent her from being holly overset by floating ice.

The 16th of April was one of the moft pleaint days they had feen. They cleared the fhip's eck of fnow; and had the good fortune to difover the anchor. On the 19th, the weather as fo much meliorated, that the mafter and vo others requested permission to sleep on board, at they might be removed from the groans d lamentations of their fick companions.

The greateft part of April was fpent in ftopng the leaks of the fhip, and repairing her her damages. In freeing her from ice and ow, the men laboured with fuch alacrity and cefs, that by the 28th the pumps were fet e. On the 20th it rained, which was a day joy, as it afforded a certain indication that the nter was beginning to break. The two folving days were very fevere; but the late rain l given the men fuch fpirits, that they fat round fire on May eve, and amufed themfelves h chufing miftreffes, and wearing their names heir caps.

The thaw increasing, on the 4th of May fome hes and geefe made their appearance; but ugh the captain and furgeon wearied themes in trying to kill fome for the use of the , they returned without fucces.

On
