Unbeaten Team in Big Four

TORONTO BEAT TECUMSEHS

PLAYING TWO PERIODS OVERTIME

Roughest and Fastest Game Played Saturday at Scarborough—Teams Even at the End of Every Quarter.

In one of the roughest and fastest games of lacrosse seen in Toronto in many a moon, the Toronto team beat the Tecumsehs at the Beach Saturday afternoon before a fair crowd, by the score of 7 to 6, after forty minutes of overtime. In the first twenty minutes of overtime both teams beat their opponents, but neither stood a tie, another extra period was necessary. Both teams were playing under the enforced play, and were pretty well tired out. Donnie and Querie started the mischief by scoring two in quick succession, and after that the Indians battled desperately to win, but things up again. Querie was only able to net one more, the game ending with the Blue Shirts still one goal to the good.
