The first Notice, the English had of Canfo's being taken and burnt, was brought to Boston by a Fisherman, who had deferied, as he was fishing upon a Bank opposite the Island, a Cloud of Smoke rising from some Ruins; and at the fame time missed the Sight of the Block-house and other Buildings there, which used to be feen off at Sea from the Bank, he was upon; and this was in a Day or two confirmed by another Massachusets Fisherman, who, after being chaced by a French Vessel, went on Shore upon the Island, where he found all the Buildings in Ruins, and that the Garrison, Inhabitants and Cattle were removed off.

This Intelligence left the Governor and Council of the Province of *Maffachufets Bay* no room to doubt from what Quarter the fudden Blow muft come, and that the War, which before was expected to break out foon between *Great Britain* and *France*, had been proclaimed in *Europe*.
