NEW YORK AND LONG ISLAND.—A Lighthouse has recently been erected on the South shore of Long Island, and eastern side of Fire Island Inlet, 20 miles north-eastward from Sandy Hook; first lighted 15th November, 1826. The light is revolving, and 60 feet in height above the level of the sea.
