WEST LAND REGULATIONS. Any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 13 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Mamitoba. Sashatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Asency or Subagency for the diatrict. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Dutes.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within in 1 miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, selely owned and occupied hy him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

Duties.—Must raide upon the homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.
