CAILLAUX WORKED WITH BERNSTORFF

Secretary Lansing Shows French Politician Enjoyed German Protection.

PLAN TO SEIZE POWER

Fallen Pacifist Intriguer Aimed at Dominating Paris—Peace Referendum.

Washington, Jan. 16.—The state department gave out the following interpreted telegrams sent by Count Bernstorff to Berlin regarding Caillaux, whose arrest followed information supplied by Secretary Lansing: Feb. 4, 1915, Buenos Aires telegrams the following: Buenos Aires after a short stay and is going direct to France evidently on account of the (undecipherable) scandal which he regards as a personal attack upon himself. He speaks contemptuously of the president and the rest of the French Government with the exception of Briand. He sees in the war no struggle for existence on the part of England. Also he spoke much of the "indiscretions and clumsy policy of the Wilhelmstrasse and professed to believe in German atrocities, he was in essentials hardly changed.

"Caillaux welcomed indirect courtesies from me but emphasized the extreme caution which he is obliged to show as the French Government, he said, had him watched even here.

He warns us against the excessive praise bestowed upon him by our papers, especially The News (New York), Presse, and desired on the other hand, that the Mediterranean and Morocco agreements should be adversely criticized. Our praise injures his position in France. Caillaux's reception here was cool. His report about Briand to France he will begin to reside in his own constituency. He fears Paris and the fate of Jaures."

Another message, which Count von Bernstorff had forwarded was from Havana as follows: "To Rio de Janeiro telegrams steamer Araguay left Buenos Aires Jan. 30. The captain is carrying important papers. Capture very desirable. Caillaux is on board. In case of capture, Caillaux should, in an obstructive way, be treated with courtesy and consideration. Can you inform our cruisers?"

"Bernstorff." German Censorship Instructions. The instruction of the German censorship to the German press on June 16, 1917, follows: "For political reasons, it is urgently requested that nothing be written about the former French Premier Caillaux, and that his name be not mentioned under any circumstances."

A wireless message received in Paris today from Rome declares documents found in the strong box of former Premier Caillaux there show how Caillaux planned to assume dictatorial powers if he were made premier of France, and planned the arrest of President Poincaré, Premier Briand and other statesmen. Caillaux also planned the dissolution of the chamber of deputies, it was charged.

General Sarraill was to be appointed commander-in-chief of the French armies, according to the plans found in Rome. Two regiments to be recruited in Corsica were to be brought to Paris under the command of two generals, both friends of Caillaux. Then after a last military effort, Caillaux planned to submit the question of

Prohibition Wanted. Rev. Dr. John Clifford, the well-known nonconformist minister, writes to The Daily Chronicle to advocate the adoption by England and the Canadian example in prohibiting the use of grain for making intoxicants. He says: "This completes the emancipation of Canada from the drink trade. It was nearly 'dry' before. Now it is wholly so. Canada has come into this war, and come wholly and without any reservation whatsoever. Therefore Canada gives battle not only to the central powers of Europe but to everything that helps the enemy."

"America has done the same. Why cannot England follow?" In acknowledging a parcel of gifts from the Canadian War Contingent Association, Pte. C. E. Gray, Canadian Machine Gun Corps, says: "I have received some socks and mufflers and gloves. I can assure you as a Tommy I can really appreciate them. I think it's very good of the women folk to do so much for us out here, and believe me, the boys appreciate it, especially myself, as I've no folks at home to send me comforts. There are three of us boys here at it out here for the last 3 1/2 years. One brother is in the British navy since 1914."

Scottish hospitality to Canadian and other overseas soldiers has made another advance. Arrangements have been completed between the Scottish Unionist Club and the Edinburgh branch of the Victoria League, for the use of the club premises in Princess street, Edinburgh, as an overseas club. The premises in Rutland square were inadequate and the members of the Unionist Club, when approached, decided unanimously to grant the use of the premises for at least the next 12 months.

B. C. GOVERNMENT AIDS LOGGING OF SPRUCE

Provincial Administration Will Take Airplane Timber From Vacant Crown Lands.

Victoria, Jan. 16.—An order-in-council passed by the provincial executive late last night grants powers to the government to arrange with the imperial munitions board for the logging of spruce upon all vacant areas of crown lands, and calls upon such holders to proceed with the necessary operations forthwith. On failure to comply on the part of such holders the right is reserved to the minister to instruct the department of lands to make its own arrangements in co-operation with the imperial munitions board, with equal compensation to follow in respect to the timber so cut.

Premier Brewster has wired to Premier Borden: "We look with confidence to your government to co-operate with us and if necessary to support our action by order-in-council under section 6 of the War Measures Act."

MONTREAL CONTROLLER DEAD. Montreal, Jan. 16.—Controller Thomas Cote, Montreal, died this morning. He was born at Trois Pistoles, Quebec, Sept. 22, 1849. He was editor of La Presse, Montreal, and L'Opinion Publique, Worcester, Mass. Paris, Jan. 16.—Louis Loustalet, member of the French Chamber of Deputies, from Landes, whose immunity recently was suspended in connection with the Caillaux case, was arrested this morning. The news of M. Loustalet's arrest spread quickly, and a number of adherents to see him leave his residence cried "Down with the traitor!"

Premier Clemenceau's paper, L'Homme Libre, says that additional documents have reached Paris from the United States concerning Loustalet and Comby. These give details of Comby's trip to Switzerland when he was accompanied by Loustalet.

Russian on Special Mission Ends His Life in New York

New York, Jan. 16.—Nicholas Iseguine, who, according to the Russian consulate here, has been in the United States on a special mission for the Russian government, was found in his apartment here today with a bullet wound in his breast. He was taken to a hospital, where it was said there was slight chance of his recovery.

Russian consular officials declared, however, they did not know the nature of Iseguine's mission in this country. A note found in Iseguine's apartment said: "Death comes perfectly voluntarily."
