ACT OF LEGISLATION TO RECTIFY A BLUNDER. Premier Whitney Criticizes Amendment to Municipal Act Proposed by City.

A routine session of the legislature yesterday accomplished a good deal of business in the two hours during which the members sat. Hon. Mr. Cochrane's Mines Act amendment was returned to committee for some technical amendments and reported for third reading.

Three first readings were: To amend the Assessment Act—Mr. Downey. To amend the act respecting joint stock companies supplying cities, towns and villages with gas and water—Mr. Fraser.

Government orders got a fair share of attention. The Sudbury Judicial District Bill was advanced a stage, and the new game bill was given a formal second reading, discussion being related to the committee stage.

Hon. G. P. Graham put in his standing protest against the method adopted by giving money to the university. It was to be thoroughly understood that it was not opposing the interests of the university, which all parties were agreed must be maintained. The income of the university should have nothing to do with the income derived from any source, such as was involved in the earmarking of the succession duties for this purpose.
