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ATHLETIC CLUB AT ST. PAUL'S

COBALT NEWS

The camp's shipments steadily improve, and the smaller returns for the initial shipment of the Temiskaming Company have been received. For a fraction less than 27 tons they have received \$90,000, and this is from a mine less than ten months ago was termed by some a wildcat, and located in what was considered as outside the shipping territory.

The Temiskaming vein on the surface was nothing but a calcite stringer, and a depth of 40 feet only small values had been proved. At the 45-foot level silver was found, and at the 75-foot depth a magnificent ore body was found. From an ore chute 40 feet long the 27 tons were taken.

M. L. Foley, of Toronto, who is largely interested in mines at Cobalt, has just returned from a trip to Larder Lake, where he has been making a general inspection of the camp, as well as personal interests. He says Larder Lake is a very promising gold-producing camp, that the quality of the ore is low-grade, and found in large quantities, good silver values are also being found in the gold-bearing rock, the average value of which will run about \$7 to \$10 to the ton. Such rich ore has been obtained wherever any development has been done; of course, there are places where free gold is found in the quartz leads, which will run thousands of dollars to the ton; but the most encouraging of all is that there are tremendous deposits of low-grade ore. A number of stamp mills are already being installed, wagon roads are being built from Boston station and Boston Creek on the T. and M. O. Railway, and it is hoped that the spur line of the T. and M. O. Railway will be completed into the camp before the summer is over. Thousands of prospectors from all parts of the country are rushing in, many of whom have been there for months, and are returning with more supplies and help, to find more and develop what they have found. The camp will soon be ranked among the famous shippers.
