THE LOCAL MARKET

There was not the usual Saturday attendance at the local market today, owing partly to the bad condition of the roads and the weather.

Poultry was in good demand. Chickens were picked up as soon as they reached the market by eager buyers, and the most of them brought 35c per pound. A few turkeys brought 42c per pound.

Eggs in the market house were being sold for the dozen.

No change in the price of butter. The live hog market looks firmer at \$10.00 per cwt. Tuesday's market usually sets the price for the hog market for the week.

Winnipeg, Feb. 28.—Oats closed up for both months. Barley closed 1/2c up for May and 1/4c higher for July. Flax closed 1/2c up for May and 1/4c higher for July.

WALL STREET.

New York, March 1.—Wall Street, 10:30 a.m.—Week-end profit-taking, probably accounted for the irregular tone of the stock market at the opening of today's trading. Shipments and equipment orders were the strongest feature, and oil and motors were again heavy. Royal Dutch, Mexican Petroleum, International Linseed and General Motors yielded 1/2 to 1 points in the first half. Advance Shipments, Springfield and National Corporation and Kelly-Springfield field rose 1/2 to 1 points. Federal Reserve Bank and Industrial Union moved to higher levels, but United States Steel was under moderate pressure.
