FREIGHT SHED PLANS HAVE YET TO ARRIVE

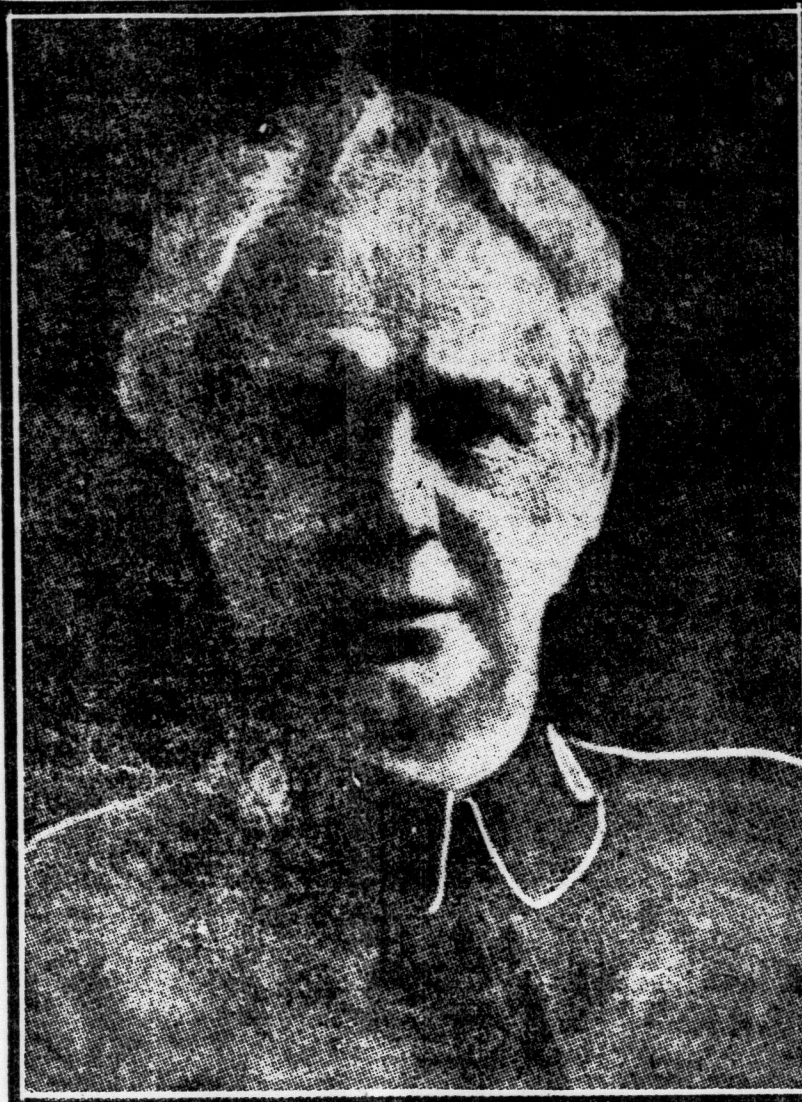
Building Inspector Wants to See Them Before Issuing Permit.

Plans for the new Grand Trunk freight sheds have not yet arrived from Montreal, and Building Inspector Piper is still holding the permit in his office, although an application specifying a temporary structure has been duly filed. "I don't want to risk them putting anything over on me," said Mr.

Piper, "and so I would like to see the plans before I mail them the permit." On the other hand, the Grand Trunk has its engineers and staff ready to start work from the tentative plans understood locally, so probably Mr. Piper will issue a temporary working permit some time today.

The new sheds proper will be of frame structure covered with iron, and will extend in length a little over 600 feet and 50 in width. An office building, two stories in height and fronting on Wellington street will be 50 feet square. The estimated cost of the whole structure is \$28,000.

WANT MAIL BOXES ON ALL HOUSES

Postoffice Department Makes Request of Public.

In order that a more prompt and satisfactory delivery of mail matter by letter-carrier be given the public, the postoffice department respectfully requests the co-operation of all citizens by having a mail-box or letter-drop placed in the front doors of all residences and stores, especially in apartment buildings.

If this were done it would not be necessary for the letter-carrier to wait at the door to effect delivery of mail personally before proceeding on his route, and in cases where the occupant was not home, the mail could still be left, instead of being taken back to the postoffice, where it would remain until the next delivery.

GAMBLING CHARGE IS DISMISSED IN COURT

Meeting To Discuss Plans For Jewish School, Say Men Arrested.

Joseph Lepovitch, Jacob Harris, Maurice White, Maurice Gootson and Barry Lewis were all dismissed in police court this morning on charges of violating the Lord's Day act by gambling.

On Sunday night, in answer to a telephone call, Police Constable Gavin Monahan, Ray Brummer and John A. Meyers went to 181 William street. P. C. Brummer stayed at the front of the house, and the other two officers went to the back. These two swore that through a window they saw the five accused sitting at a table playing cards, and that there was money on the table. When P. C. Brummer rang the front doorbell, the cards and money were seen to disappear.

Finally the three policemen got into the house—one by the front door, and two by the rear. The accused claimed that they had broken the door to get in, but the policemen stated that the doors were opened for them. It was stated also that the men refused to give their names, so they were taken to the station. Gootson and Harris had given their names to one of the constables. It was discovered afterward, in the pocket of an overcoat belonging to Lewis, a cardcase was found. He thought that it had been there for some days. He said that there was a meeting in progress to plan for the raising of funds for a Jewish school, when the policemen entered. Lewis and all the others denied participating in a game of cards.

W. R. Meredith, Albert M. Judd and Maurice Gootson were the co-accused for the defence. Maurice defended his own case. Several times when Gootson repeated questions which had been asked by other counsel, he was told by the court that he must be brief, as he was only junior counsel.

CHIEF DISPATCHER GOES TO ALLANDALE

Well-Deserved Promotion For A. F. Sharpe of Grand Trunk Railway.

Mr. A. F. Sharpe, chief train dispatcher of the London and Hamilton divisions of the Grand Trunk Railway, has been appointed trainmaster at Allandale, 13th and 14th districts, to take the place of Mr. W. J. Pigeon, who has been appointed superintendent at Stratford. Mr. Sharpe will leave for Allandale this evening. His family will follow shortly.

Mr. W. M. Doherty has been appointed day chief dispatcher at London and Mr. W. K. Rogers as night clerk here.
