"The horrible massacres of women and children, and the atroclous manner in which they handled deported Armenians is past description. One could not travel along the country roads without seeing evidence of the brutality in the piles of bodies on the roadside. Whole families of well educated Armenians have been wiped out by the Turks." Mr. Pierce gave some instances of the cruelty of the Turks to the Armenians, and appealed for prayers and help for this suffering nation.


