





THREE MILLION YEARS OLD



There has just been completed in Toronto the "unrocking" of an almost perfect skeleton of one of the Dinosaur family, which used to gambol in the valley of the Red River, Alberta, some 3,000,000 years ago. Should Arrest Fashion Queens For Indecent Exposure, Claim

TORONTO, Nov. 10 .- "Some of the fashionably dressed women of Ontario should be arrested for indecent exposure," declared Dr. Margaret Patterson of this city at this afternoon's session of the annual convention of the Ontario Women's Institutes. The question of women's dress came up in connection with a resolution submitted from the Muskoka Women's Institute condemning the state of the contemplate of the state of the stat atitute condemning the present-day tendency toward immodesty of dress. The concensus of opinion of the delegates to the annual conven-tion was that the immodest styles prevailing at present were attribu-table to lack of home training of the young people, and generally relaxed discipline in the home. Censorship of the moving pictures

This led to a request by counsel for the Bell Telephone Company that proceedings should be hastened, since they claimed that under the present rates the company was losing \$200,000 a month.

Apart from Quebec and the south shore representatives there was a unanimity of opinion that if the Bell Telephone Company could show that it was entitled to an advance in its rates, this should be granted.

OPPOSE MEASURE PLAN.
