REPORT.

"Allelujah, for the Lord God omnipotent reigneth." A fact eclared in the sacred oracles, though largely discredited by the busy, sinning, spiritually-unobserving world, but, in the condant development of events, (as they operate to the secular adrantage or disadvantage of individuals, whether occupying high or low positions among men; or result in the elevation, decline or fall of nationalities, -) to the pious believer and worker, the progress of those events but indicate the march of God, as he advances, -steadily, persistently advances, in the vindication of his honor, in the assertion of his sovereign right, in the avenging of his own elect, and in the taking vengeance upon his enmies, until the promised time arrives when He, whose right it "shall, take the kingdom and possess it forever, even forever From year to year, there is much to animate to aith and hope, and also much to stimulate to zeal and earnest effort, all who, in this world, are ranged on the Lord's side, working and fighting in reference to the better day promised of God s yet to come; and the year last past is no exception to the rule. Against each and all of these is evangelistic effort righteously, and only right when earnestly directed; and the result, so far, proves that, "greater is He who is with us than all that are against us—" that there is more vitality, and consequently greater aggressive power in our holy Christianity, than in any opposing system; and hence, experience supplements the Scripture testimony, and adds force to the Divine declaration, that "of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end"-that He shall have the "heathen for his inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for his possession.
