BECK IN THE FIELD.

(Toronto Globe.) Sir Adam Beck has decided to accept the nomination offered him in London for reasons which he discusses in a public statement issued today. He points to two great issues affecting the future of the Hydro-Electric System of Ontario which will come up for settlement during the term of the next Legislature. One is the question of the revision of the Waterways Treaty between Canada and the United States so as to permit the increased diversion of the waters at Niagara for power purposes. The other is the making of an agreement between the Dominion and Ontario Governments on the other for the proper utilization of the water powers of the St. Lawrence. It is imperative that the interests of Ontario be safeguarded in these matters. The permanent welfare of the province is at stake. The growth of the demand for hydro-electric power is so rapid that the problem will not wait. It is, therefore, necessary that the power consumed by the province, present and prospective—and they are or will be virtually all the people of Ontario—shall have a spokesman in the Legislature who can give the House and the public expert and disinterested advice and information. The Globe hopes that, in view of these explanations, the Liberals of the city of London will look upon Sir Adam as a unique public servant, not as a party candidate, and will refrain from putting "a lidate in the field."
