MRS. GROSVENOR HURT IN RUNAWAY

Young New York Society Woman Thrown from Her Horse and Her Spine Severely Injured.

Newport, R. I., April 18—Mrs. Robert Grosvenor, young society woman of New York, was in a runaway accident while horseback riding here and is now suffering from a severe injury to her spine. This was determined after an examination at the Newport Hospital to which she was rushed after being picked up from the street where she fell.

Mrs. Grosvenor, who has been spending the winter here, went out for a morning canter. While on one of the country roads in Middletown the horse took fright and made a wild dash into this city. Mrs. Grosvenor is a good horse-woman. She stuck to her saddle and made desperate efforts to get control of the animal, but without success. Three miles from the place where the horse started to run Mrs. Grosvenor was thrown at Spring and Levin streets, landing on her back on the sidewalk. At several points people tried to stop

SHIELDS FOR NEW TUNNEL

Plans for Six Steel Shields for Boring Under Hudson Announced.

Chester, Pa., April 18—The Merchant Shipbuilding Corporation announced it would fabricate six tunnel shields of structural steel for the new Hudson River vehicular tunnels. The shields will be cylindrical in form, thirty feet in diameter, sixteen feet long and weigh approximately 280 tons each. The exterior shell will consist of four ply steel plating, within which will be placed a second shell of steel plating, bulkheads, bracing and operating equipment.

The shields are used for driving the tunnels after the shafts have been sunk. They will be forced forward through the river bed along the line of the tunnels by hydraulic jacks, operating under a pressure of 6,000 pounds to the square inch.

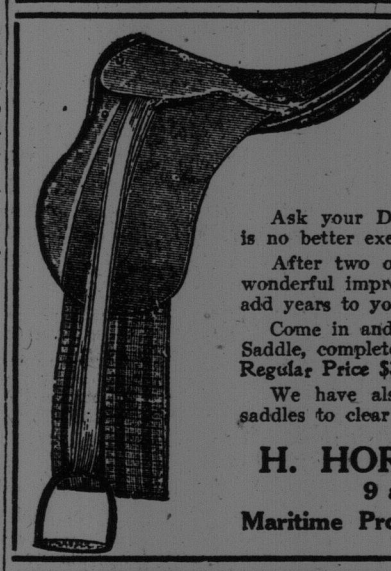
