Success of Local Boy In New York Ad. Field

Medley Scovill, Well Known in This City Now in New York, Prominent in Banking Advertising Circles.

Announcement has been received in this city of the recent organization in New York of the firm of Medley Scovill & Co. This announcement contains more than usual local interest inasmuch as Medley Scovill, the head of the new company, was born in Kingston (N. B.) and is a former St. John boy.

Mr. Scovill, who is well known in this city and other Canadian centres, has achieved prominence in New York publishing circles and has for years been identified with the development of business from the advertising side. Five years ago he formed his own company, Medley Scovill, Incorporated, which under his management, was notably successful, specializing in financial and export advertising for some of the largest international banks and other financial institutions in the United States.

The rapid development of the business and its growing opportunities prompted Mr. Scovill to reorganize the company on a much larger scale. The new corporation, Medley Scovill & Co., was the result. Medley Scovill retains the presidency and the controlling interest, but has now associated with him in executive capacities Charles Lee Scovill, formerly of the New York banking house of Spencer Trask & Co., also a St. John boy, and H. Lamson Scovill, formerly of the Scovill Manufacturing Company of Waterbury (Conn.), the oldest and largest independent brass manufacturing corporation in the United States, which employed over 14,000 hands during the war.

Medley Scovill is active in Canadian circles in the United States, being a member and former chairman of the Canadian Club of New York, also a member of The Pilgrims, and other Canadian and British organizations.

A detail of policemen quelled the riot. The drivers were cut and bruised, but seemed most concerned over the loss of their charges.
