NORTON GRIFFITHS SHIELD RACE

There has been some talk recently of reviving the yearly contests for the Norton Griffiths shield for power boat racing in the harbor, but there seems to be difficulty in getting any organization to stage the event. The trophy has been in the hands of the board of trade and in 1918 they offered to hand it over to the St. John Power Boat Club, but so far the club has not seen its way clear to take it.

The shield was given by J. Norton Griffiths, M. P., to mark the opening of the work on the new harbor at Courtenay Bay on July 11, 1912, with the intention of promoting power boat racing in Canada and to bring the St. John harbor into prominence in this way. It was to be competed for in five consecutive years, but only three races were completed, the war interfering after the 1914 event. It is now proposed to run off the other two years' matches. The trophy is to be awarded to the boat owner who secures the greatest number of wins and in the event of a tie, there is to be a deciding race. In 1912 the Patricia, owned by Dr. Barton, won, covering the twelve-knot course in 30 minutes 58 seconds; the following year premier honors went to Cackoo, owned by Peter Clinch, time 1:09.58 and in 1914 the Patricia, then owned by Robert McAllister, captured the event in forty-six minutes. As three boat owners have each won one of the events, the three are tied for the ownership of the trophy.

Egyptian Troubles

WERE COSTLY IN LIFE

Eight Hundred Natives, 31 White Civilians and 29 Soldiers Were Killed

London, July 22.—In addition to 800 natives who were killed and 1,000 wounded during the recent disturbances in Egypt, Under Foreign Secretary Harcourt announced in House of Commons last night that the casualties to Europeans and other civilians were: Killed, 31; wounded, 38.

The casualties to the military were: Killed, 29; wounded, 114.

The death sentence was imposed on thirty-nine natives, and detention for life on twenty-seven. Upwards of 2,000 were sentenced to short terms of imprisonment. The military courts have been dispensed with, the sentences which they imposed being reduced by three months.

PIE CRUST
Take 1/2 cup flour with 1/4 cup of Benson's Corn Starch, 1/2 teaspoonful baking powder, 2 tablespoonfuls of Maida, or butter, 1/4 cup of cold water, 1/4 teaspoonful salt. Stir flour, corn starch, and baking powder in a bowl, add shortening, rub fine through flour, add last water and salt. Turn onto board, roll lengthwise till smooth and use as desired.

ORANGE CREAM PIE
Place in saucepan over the fire, 1 tablespoonful Benson's Corn Starch, 1/2 cup water, 1/2 tablespoonful of sugar and 1/2 cup of Lily White Corn Syrup. Boil five minutes. Remove from fire, add yolks of two eggs, 1/2 tin of orange, and juice of one orange and 1/4 lemon; mix well. Line greased pie pan with very thin pie crust, brush out with beaten egg, and sprinkle with bread crumbs. Pour in above mixture and bake in medium oven till crust is light brown.

Beat the whites of the eggs very, very stiff; add one table-spoonful of powdered sugar. Arrange by spoonfuls on top of pie and set in hot oven to brown a nice color.

Serve cold.
