

THIRD WITNESS
FOR PROSECUTION (cont'd)

- A. 49 A kit inspection is made and he is given credit for any articles recovered.
- Q. 50 Are those checked with the M.F.C. 800?
- A. 50 Absolutely.
- Q. 51 Does the copy of the M.F.C. 800 that you have produced to the Court show the recoveries?
- A. 51 No, it does not. We have another M.F.C. 800.
- Q. 52 Is there usually any change made in the M.F.C. 800 to show that credit was given to the accused?
- A. 52 Yes, Sir.
- Q. 53 Has that been done in this case?
- A. 53 No, Sir.
- Q. 54 Why not?
- A. 54 I believe a list of recoveries was made.
- Q. 55 Have you any testimony to give to the Court to the effect that such credit was given to him?
- A. 55 Yes, Sir.
- Q. 56 Have you such evidence to give to the Court?
- A. 56 Not now, but there is a list.
- Q. 57 Is that list available?
- A. 57 I believe they have a copy here, Captain Jack had a copy.

Questioned by the Court.

- Q. 58 You mentioned that the accused's kit was picked up at his home?
- A. 58 It was picked up at his home by S/Sgt. Morris.
- Q. 59 Were you with S/Sgt. Morris at the time it was picked up?
- A. 59 No, Sir.
- Q. 60 How do you know personally it was S/Sgt. Morris?
- A. 60 He signed the inventory of kit, he was one of the witnesses, he belongs to the Security Guard.
- Q. 61 At the time the articles were recovered by S/Sgt. Morris were they held and shown to the accused?
