Russia to Occupy Armenia. London, July 26.—A dispatch to the Daily Express from Rome says: "The powers have authorized Russia to occupy Armenia in order to compel Turkey to withdraw behind the Enos-Midra line, the new frontier between Turkey and Bulgaria as fixed by the treaty of London."

On Native Soil. Egmond, July 26.—Ex-King Manuel and Princess Augusta Victoria of Hohenzollern will be married on the 4th of September. NEW GUARD LINER, ANDANIA, HAS ARRIVED AT BOSTON—GOOD TRIP

Seventy-three Years Ago Since First Ship of this Line Crossed Atlantic—Is Fine Vessel.

Montreal, July 27.—The new Guard liner Andania arrived at this port on her maiden voyage from Southampton today.

Cap. Miller was well pleased with the vessel's behavior on the passage out, and the passengers were unusually in the appreciation of the boat's accommodations.

Being a new ship, no attempt was made to test the speed of the Andania and as a dense fog was experienced for three days, it would have been impossible.

Including detention caused by the fog, which totalled 47 hours 34 minutes, the Andania covered the 2,512 miles from Bishop's Rocks, outside Southampton to Father Point, in 7 days 20 hours 36 minutes, an average speed of 13.32 knots an hour. She brought 1,395 passengers, of whom 440 were cabin and 955 third class.

It is seventy-three years ago this month since the Britannia, the first Cunard steamship, arrived at the port of Boston.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS. COAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for a term of one year, renewable at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2500 acres can be leased to one person or family.

UNASSURED TERRITORY. The tract must be attended to by the applicant in person, and personal application to the Registrar of the District must be made and the rent of \$1000 per acre paid to the agent within thirty days after the date of the application.

QUARTZ—A person eighteen years of age and over, having made a discovery of quartz, may locate a claim 100 feet by 100 feet. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, to be reported to the Registrar. When \$5000 has been expended or paid, the claim may be purchased for \$1000.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. THIS sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at the office of any Local Agent of Dominion Lands (not sub-agent) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within three miles of his homestead on farm or other business, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required in every case, except when residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section of his homestead. Price, \$3 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and to clear extra cultivation. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of touch, scrubby or stony land after report by Homestead Inspector on application for patent.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$1 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 80 acres and erect a house worth \$200.
