Paris, Jan. 21—The final list of Ger-mans whose extradition will be asked by the Allies, as approved by the Su-preme Council yesterday, is supposed to contain somewhat less than 600 names out of the original 1400 accused by the different Allies. It is under-stood that the list has not yet been delivered to the Germans and the de-lay in handing it over indicates that negotiations are still in progress. The Germans are insting strongly upon trial of the accused in their Courts.


