THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL:

WHIREAS Subsection (a) of Section 76 of the Dominion Lands Act, 1903, provides that the Governor in Council may withdraw from the operation of the Act, subject to existing rights as defined or created thereunder, such lands as have been or may be reserved for Indians.

THEREFORE His Royal Highness the Governor Ceneral in Council is pleased to Order that the lands comprised within the following reserves shall be and the same are hereby withdrawn from the operations of the Dominion Lands Act, subject to existing rights as defined or created thereunder, namely:

Fisher River Indian reserve, No. 44, as shown

on the following official plans:

plan of township twenty-eight, range one, east of the principal meridian, approved and confirmed on the twelfth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten;

Plan of township twenty-nine, range one, east of principal mer dian, approved and confirmed on the thirty-first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twelve;

plan of township twenty-right, range two, east of the principal meridian, approved and confirmed on the eighteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and

twelv plan of township twenty-nine, range two, east of the principal meridian, approved and confirmed on the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and

twelve; excepting thereout and therefrom those portions of the said reserve previously withdrawn from the operation of the Dominion Lands Act a d set aside for the use of the Indians by Orders in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninetysix and the second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eleven; the portions of the said reserve hereby withdrawn from the operations of the Dominion Lands Act containing by admeasurement fourteen square miles and six hundredthe of a square mile, more or less.
