PETERS, Hon. FREDERICK, Q.C. (*Queen's, 3rd Dist.*).

S. of the late Hon. James H. Peters, Master of the Rolls, P.E.I., who married the eldest dau. of the late Sir Samuel Cunard, Bart. B. in Charlottetown, and ed. at King's Coll., Windsor, N.S. Called to the English Bar, July, 1876, and to the Bars of P.E.I. and N.S. in the same year. Apptd Q.C. 1894. On the resignation of the McLeod Administration in April, 1891, became Premier and Attorney-General of the Province. First returned to House of Assem., Jan., 1890; re-elected, May, 1891, by acclamation, and re-elected at g. e., 1893. A Liberal.—*Charlottetown, P.E.I.*

PROWSE, LEMUEL F. (*Queen's County, etc.*).

B. in Charlottetown, 2 Feb., 1858, and ed. there. M., 22 July, 1879, Frances, dau. of Geo. Stanley of Pownal, P.E.I. Is a mem. of the firm of Prowse Bros., dry goods merchants, Charlottetown. First returned to House of Assem. at g. e., 1893. A Liberal.—*Charlottetown.*

RICHARD, Hon. JAMES WILLIAM (*Prince, 2nd Dist.*).

S. of Hon. Wm. Richard, Ex.-M.P., a native of Swansea, Wales, who, after having been engaged in seafaring, settled about 1852 at Bideford, where he built and owned vessels trading chiefly to South America. B. at Swansea, 31 May, 1850. Ed. at Prince of Wales' and St. Dunstan's Coll., Charlottetown. Unmarried. First returned to House of Assem., Oct., 1873, on resignation of sitting mem. Re-elected by acclamation, 1876; re-elected at g. e., 1879, and again by acclamation at g. e., 1882; re-elected at g. e., 1886, 1890 and 1893. Apptd. a mem. of the Ex. Council, 22 April, 1891. A Conservative.—*Bideford.*

ROBERTSON, ALEXANDER D. (*King's, 1st Dist.*).

Grandfather came from Perthshire, Scotland, in 1808. B., 5 March, 1849, at West River, East Point, P.E.I. Ed. in the district schools and Charlottetown Normal School. M., 24 Feb., 1887, Bertha Lydia, dau. of Donald Fraser. Is a merchant and farmer. First returned to House of Assem. at by-election, held 13 April, 1891. A Liberal.—*Red Point, Lot 26, P.E.I.*
