Repealed and reenacted by 25 Geo. 3, c. 4, s. 1, and by 25 Geo. 3, c. 5. 2 An ACT intituled An Act for imposing a Duty of Four Pence per Gallon on Rum, and other Spirituous Liquors, &c. for regulating the Conduct of Tavern-Keepers, and for altering and amending an Act, made and passed in the Thirteenth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, imposing a Duty on Retailers of Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors.
