**Review: Tolkien's first best-seller**

My editor has assigned me the pleasant task of previewing a novel that has yet to be written. Ordinarily this would present a few problems, but as I am also the author of this as yet unwritten novel, I feel I can give an adequate preview.

The publisher of the novel as yet has not been contacted. Neither have the terms of the contract been discussed, or the date of possible publication set. His journey will last several years, and will parallel his journey from adolescence into manhood. He will have strong moral convictions, and will win the hearts of all readers.

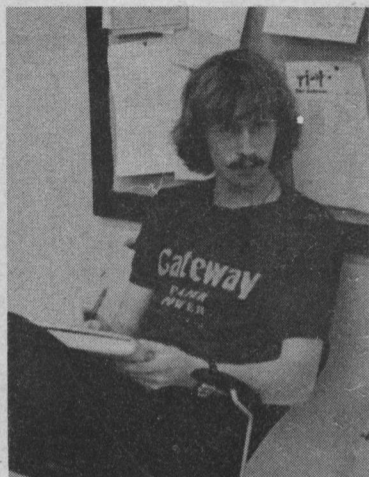
The story will go farther than just being entertaining. It will also be an exercise in

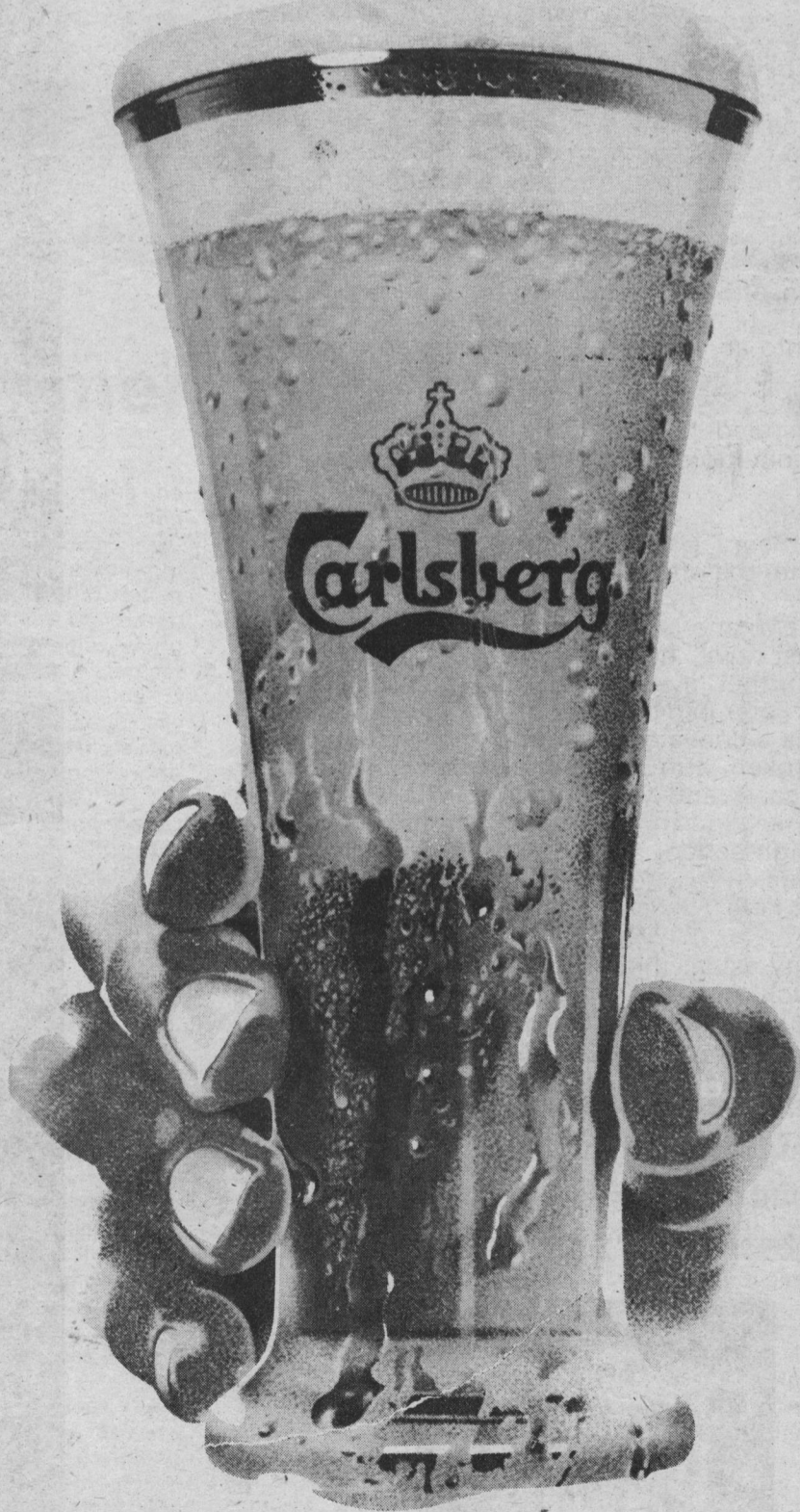
