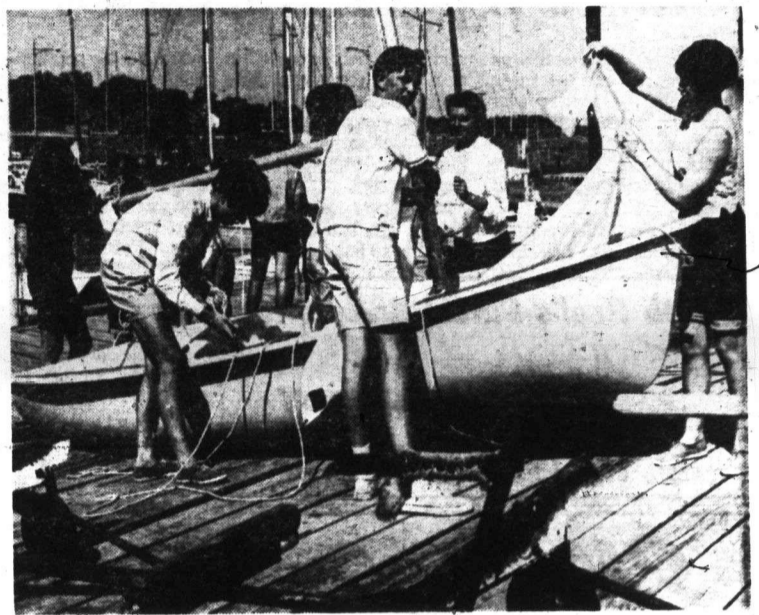


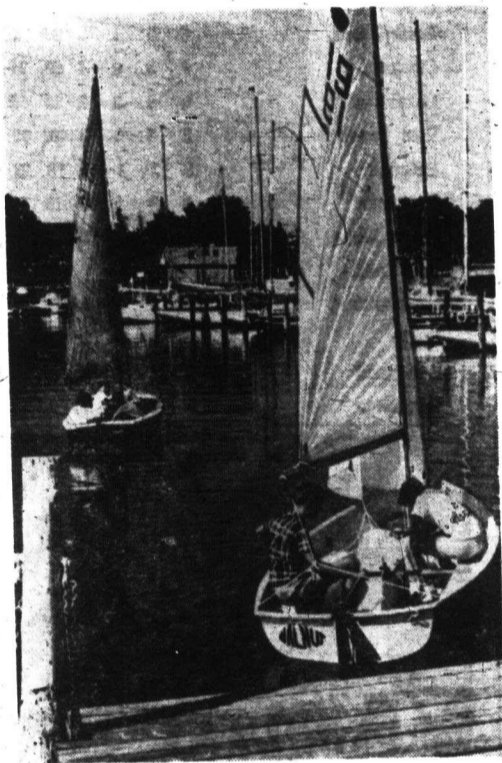
What A Way To Spend A Summer

The junior sailors of the Port Credit Yacht Club hold classes five days a week. They learn, in the summer months, to handle a sail boat safely.

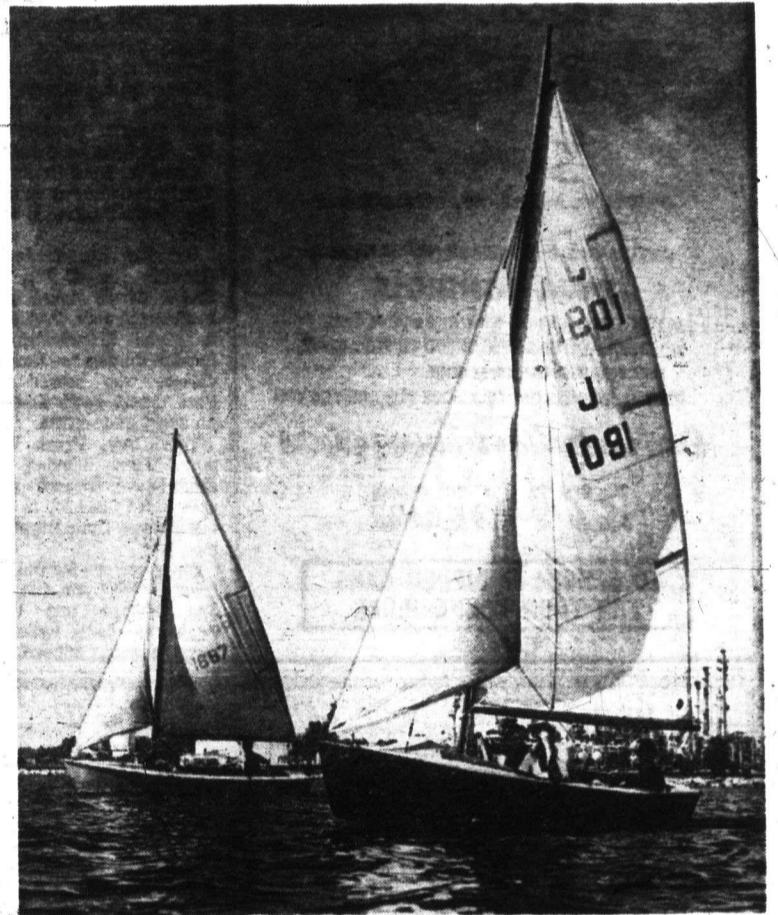
Each day starts off with classes at the blackboard. Then out to the boats to learn proper rigging techniques.

The juniors sail a wooden boat, sturdy and safe, yet maneuverable enough for easy handling. These boats are the Blue J class.

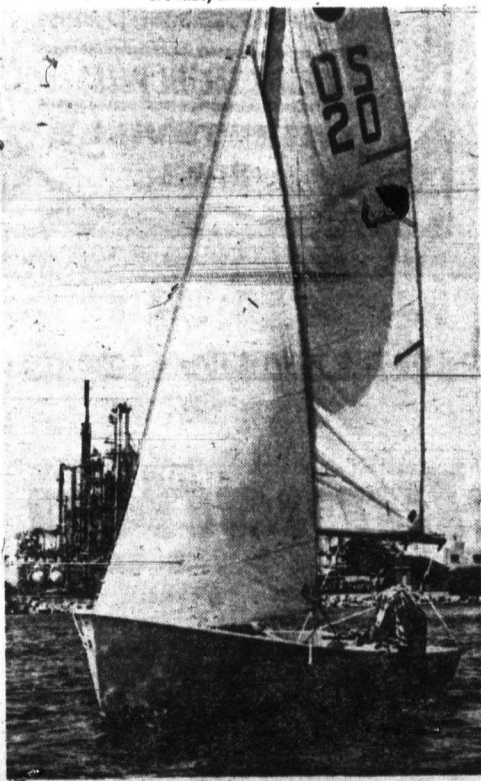
