Two Sergeants, one Corporal, twelve tradesmen from Maintenance Wing posted to No. 133 (F) Squadron, Lethbridge. The Administrative Officer at Maintenance Wing lectured to G.I.S. staff in the afternoon on the administrative procedure in the B.C.A.T.P. Cpl. Hunter, W.L., who has been employed at G.I.S., posted to Trenton to take a course in court reporting. Flt.Lt. J.W. Green, Medical Officer, reported for duty from Recruiting Centre, Vancouver, and immediately proceeded to R.C.A.F. Station East Calgary on temporary duty. Flying Officer P.G. Bull reported for duty on posting from No. 5 E.S.T.S., High River. The heat was cut off in all buildings with the exception of the hospitals.</p> <p>Flying carried out for 10:05 hours during day. Maximum Possible Flying Hours - 24:00;</p>

Norseman 2465 of No. 2 Wireless School had "B" class crash at south end of field - burst into flames but was promptly extinguished by crash crew and very little damage to the aircraft. Two ambulances were at the scene of the accident promptly. No injuries to occupants of aircraft. Course 52 completed final examinations. Six aircraft from other stations landed and took off during the day. Gravel being hauled and placed in the parking lot near Control Tower. The damage done to a runway by Norseman Aircraft was repaired immediately by Works and Buildings.</p> <p>Flying carried out for 11:40 hours during day and 02:10 hours during night.
