



Sir,-

In regard to your inquiries as to water frontage at Blind River, between the Government dock and the Dominion Land Company's dock, I beg to say that the land in question, bordering on the water, was formerly part of the Mississauga Indian Reserve, and having been surrendered by the Indians for sale, was sold and patented to Joseph Williams, of the Village of Ratho, in the County of Oxford, Ont., on the 5th of November, 1889, and the Department has no information as to the present ownership of the land. I inclose a blue print copy of plan, showing the land in question.
